



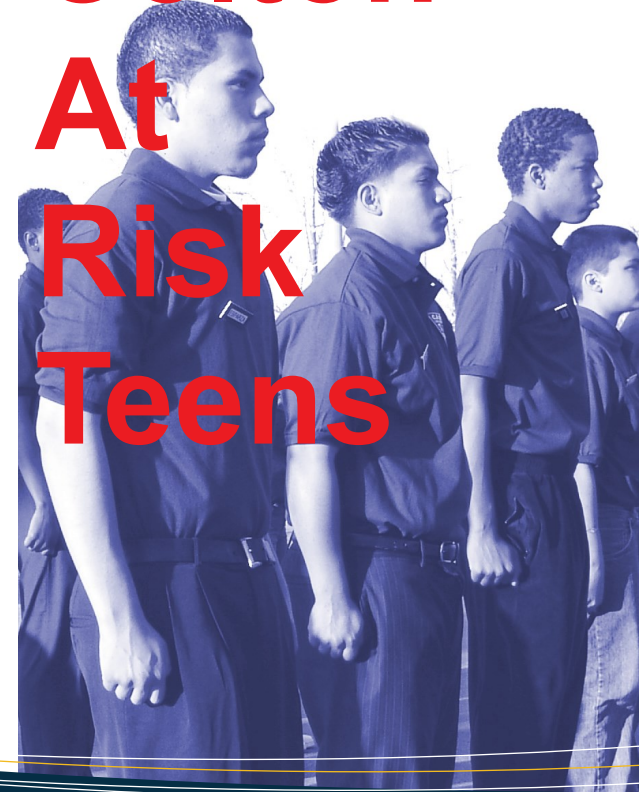
### TACTICAL STAFF / POLICE OFFICERS

Choices and consequences are stressed throughout the program. The CART academy builds self-esteem and aids in breaking the cycle of criminal behavior while guiding the student towards success.

The CART Academy meets on Wednesday evenings at 6:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Our upcoming class will be held at Summit College in Colton on August 31, 2016 at 6:00pm. Classes include physical training, close order drills, life skills training, in-class practical exercises, educational tours, classroom instruction, vocabulary tests, career development and community service.

## discipline, self-esteem, and structure are paramount

### OVERVIEW

The CART (Colton at Risk Teens) Academy is designed to introduce at-risk youth to discipline, guidance, and career development. The program is a para-military environment that allows students between the ages of 13-17 to be exposed to various levels of mentoring, career development and other topics.

### PURPOSE

This program allows students who are not responding to the curriculum in the Colton PAL Parent Project program to get involved in a more structured environment. The program will instill discipline, self-esteem and structure in a student's life. The program allows students throughout the CJUSD to become a team during the 15-week course that exposes them to various topics including:

- Character Development (Student will learn basic military marching)

- Anger Management
- Self-Respect

No cost to families enrolled in the Colton Parent Project. Community Service hours and school credit is currently under review with all involved schools and Juvenile Services.
